Students must meet the following requirements to be considered for the Lions Scholar Program:

- Upper School Requirements:
 - Achieve status of top 15% of class from previous school year.
 - Participate in the Student Leadership Institute (requires acceptance)
 - Participate in the Distinguished Achievement Program
 - New to PCA: Score in the 90th percentile in both Total Reading and Total Mathematics on admissions test.
- Middle School Requirements
 - Have and maintain “A”s in core classes: History, Math, Science, and English (5th through 8th)
